Dear House of Prayer family and friends,

First of all, thank you for the lovely brunch after worship on June 3 that marked ten years of my ministry here so far – and marked ten years of our ministry together as pastor and people. The brunch buffet was amazing, the carrot cake was luscious, and I'm glad so many of you could be here for the celebration! It was wonderful to hear from our former interns and to again realize how formative their year of internship with us has been. Thanks, Ed, for reflecting on these ten years, and thank you to all who cooked, coordinated, set up, cleaned up and did everything that made this such a wonderful event. Thanks, too, for your gifts to our Capital Campaign. We continue to be "on our way rejoicing" together. It was a lot of fun to have my children and grandchildren here for worship and the brunch, too. Now we'll get to discover what God has in mind for us as we continue as pastor and people together here at House of Prayer. I look forward to what the summer will bring and to a new program year together when fall comes.

Worship during the summer will include three weekends, one each month, when we are mindful of God's good creation. I've been thinking of these as, first, a "macro" view of creation – a cosmic view, so to speak; second, as an invitation to zero in on the life of the trees around us; and, third, as a "micro" view of creation – the infinitesimal and remarkable life we don't actually see. We profess our faith in God as Creator, so my hope is that we'll come to know our Creator a little better and our place in creation a little more.

Now and then something comes my way that I can't stop sharing. The devotion below blew me away, and I brought it to staff meeting for devotions, to the Thursday morning Bible Study folks, and to our confirmation kids and leaders. And I must have read it myself a dozen times since it showed up in my inbox early in May.

Mary Luti is a seminary professor, a United Church of Christ pastor, and a scholar whose insight and honest reflection on faith almost always speaks to me. Perhaps you too will hear "a word from the Lord" in her writing. (This comes from Daily Devotional, a UCC daily email devotion you can subscribe to. I like it a lot, and you might, too.)

"I have told you these things so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." - John 15:11

So it was all about joy.

It was for joy he was born, for joy he befriended and healed, for joy he offended the powers, for joy he said love one another and love the world even though you don't belong to it and it's never going to love you back. It was for joy he endured the terrible shame, for joy he was raised, for joy he said peace be with you and pardoned us everything, for joy he went to sit at God's right hand, for joy upon joy he will return, the first mercy and the last. It was so that his joy would be in us, and our joy would be complete.

And all this time you thought it was about duty, so you've been doing it. You thought it was about making an effort, so you've been making one. You thought it was about becoming a better person and making the world a better place, so you've slogged away. You thought it was about you, about what God wants you to do, about the difference you should be making, about getting the holy job done.

Synod Assembly – Stir It Up

Scott Morad and Vicki Oman served as House of Prayer's lay voting members at the recent New England Synod Assembly in Springfield, MA. Phoebe Morad also attended as a non-voting member, and she introduced many attendees to the work of Lutherans Restoring Creation. Pastor Henry, Scott, Vicki, Phoebe and Vicar Jonathan were among the 450 or so attendees who reelected Bishop Jim Hazelwood to serve another six-year term; worshipped together and heard fine preaching from the pastor of the English-speaking Lutheran church in Jerusalem and from the executive director of the Massachusetts Conference of Churches; attended workshops on topics as diverse as Islam, the draft social statement on Women and Justice, and The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land.

Vicar Jonathan is in the call process with a congregation in the New England Synod, and we look forward to hearing the outcome of that process this summer. We were joined for lunch one day by Pastor Sinnott and for supper by Nancy Feth, who has a shop nearby in Springfield. In doing the business of the synod, in learning, in worship, and in fellowship, the Holy Spirit was at work, stirring things up in our shared life as God's church in New England.

We were blessed on Sunday, May 6th this year with good weather and willing hearts to do the work required for the "God's Work. Our Hands." and Care for Creation event.

The day began with a special abbreviated worship service which sent us out to "do God's work for our neighbors." Ernie Hill organized teams who went out and cleaned brush, leaves and other debris from three yards in the town of Hingham. These homeowners are members of the Hingham Senior Center. Each received a potted plant and information about House of Prayer. They expressed deep appreciation to the yard crews for all that they had done. Sixteen members of the church were involved in this part of the day's activities.

Meanwhile, back at House of Prayer, another dozen members (intergenerational, young and old) took part in the Care for Creation aspect of the day. Organized by Phoebe Morad (leader in Lutherans Restoring Creation), we made twenty tree-hanging bee hives and created journals to go along with them. These gifts will be available to members of the Senior Center.

At the end of the morning, Brandy Hugo and Sally Nettles hosted a delicious luncheon with food provided by about a dozen members of our church. Social Ministry's Outreach Program benefits Ruth House

An amazing story...

God works in mysterious ways – at our last social ministry committee meeting, we heard from Janet Waters of the need at Ruth House, an Ascentria sponsored home for young mothers and their babies, for crib mattresses. HOP has had a long association with Ruth House through our Christmas giving tree. We decided to take on the job of finding a way to raise the funds/donations for those mattresses but hadn't really got started on that. Last week, I received the following email from HOP member Heather Folino:

Hi ladies,

I hope you are both well. I wanted to share a story with you about Ruth House in Brockton.

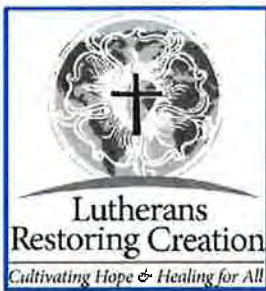
My sister works in Human Resources at Dell. When an employee has a baby, they give the mother a \$100 gift card to Babies 'R Us whose stores are closing. They had a stack of these cards that were going to be unused. My sister hated to see the money wasted and would love to do something with the money that would really help someone, but didn't know where to go with this gift. I remembered our partnerships with Ascentria and Ruth House. She was excited to have an idea and decided to stop in at a store and see what the inventory was like. Thankfully she stopped that day, because when she went into the store, they informed her it was the last day to use gift cards! She ran home to get a truck and some helpers, calling Ruth House along the way to find out what was needed most. After a very hectic 24 hours, Ruth House was the recipient of the following brand-new equipment:

6 high chairs; 6 car seats; 6 crib mattresses with covers; 8 bassinets; 2 swaddle rockers; 2 outdoor play houses; a sand box; 3 kiddie pools; and 2 outdoor climbing structures. In total, close to \$4,000 of baby goods! The program manager at Ruth House was overwhelmed with gratitude. She kept wondering out loud, 'Of all the places you could have donated these items, how did you find US?' My sister was able to find Ruth House because of HOP's longtime support to this ministry and the awareness our support brings to various causes.

- complete online Action Plan Form to be able to connect with other church's and teams trying out the same projects across the country

As a long-time member of House of Prayer, I'm grateful to this community which has fostered my expectation of people of faith to use Our Hands to do God's Work. Ramblings with Ed

³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. ⁴ For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. ⁶ Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; ⁷ if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸ the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

These verses are from Romans 12. Kathleen used them for our devotions at the last council meeting. It struck me on how appropriate they are for our council, not just the one finishing this year but also for all the councils prior to this one. We have some very special people leading us at House of Prayer!
