The January drive for Father Bill's collected \$450 worth of toiletries, warm clothing, and bedding. Thanks for all the wonderful contributions!

Wellspring Easter Dinner boxes dinner boxes will be due April 2 for pickup by Wellspring on Monday, April 3. The food list has not changed and is available on the church website. Please fill the boxes with the items and add to it with other items such as pasta, soup, tuna fish, peanut butter, etc. Copy paper boxes with lids are in high demand for this project. If you have access to boxes, please bring to church and put on the shelf over the coat rack across from the restrooms.

The committee is also sponsoring an Immigration Awareness Lunch on April 16. The event, "Welcoming the Stranger" is a potluck lunch featuring dishes from guests' ethnic roots with speaker Doreen Rinas, chair of the New England Synod's Refugee and Immigration Task Force.

#### MUSIC NOTES FROM LENAE

The music program at HOP continues with the Adult Choir singing almost every Sunday. I try to choose choral music that represents a wide variety of styles. For example, the 1<sup>st</sup> Sun. in Lent we sang a kind of folkish/blues song by Jay Beech, b. 1960, but in a few weeks we'll be singing a beautiful piece by Impressionist composer, Gabriel Fauré. (I first learned this piece in 8<sup>th</sup> gr. at the FL Allstate Festival, and immediately fell in love with it! I've had my copy of the music all these yrs. and hoped to do it with the choir someday, so now that hope is being realized!) The piano part is gorgeous, (probably why I immediately loved it!) and although a bit longer than our usual anthems, we hope you'll indulge us as it sets a nice tone for the Lent season.

We'll be doing an arrangement of a Gospel song called "Jesus Gave Me Water" in a few wks. that will feature Scott Morad as soloist. The group, "A Bunch of Guys" (4 musical guys who met at Calumet, I believe, and put out a couple of great CD's to help raise money for Calumet) included this one on their 1st CD and I loved it! We've done it a few times over the yrs., including once with a large Men's Ensemble as part of the HOP Vocal/Choral Concert back in 2014!

For the story of the raising of Lazarus, we'll be doing an arrangement of a Negro spiritual that will also feature Scott Morad as soloist.

On Ash Wed., Kathleen Almand, Phoebe and Thea Morad, Sandy Swanson and I sang a Handel piece, "Wash Me Thoroughly", and Kathleen also shared her talent on violin for the prelude, playing a movement of a Vivaldi violin sonata.

So you can see -- we do a wide range of music at HOP! I hope this 'peaks your curiosity' and that you'll come to worship all during Lent to hear scripture, music that supports those scriptures, and great sermons by Vicki Oman and Pr. Beatrice!
