Transition/Call Committee

The Transition Committee coffee hour topic on April 23rd is: With God All Things are Possible. Scott Hudson-Bryant will be the presenter. Please join us!

Here's the <u>recap from the March 5th coffee hour talk</u> "Why did God plant this church?", lead by Kim Boyd Part of the introduction given was that our WHY is who we are as a church, no matter what we do or where we go. This "WHY" has to be willing to drive us when we feel we can't go on anymore, or are feeling lost. It should also be applicable to every aspect of our church life.

The questions to guide us for this week's talk were: (these were supposed to be answered in small groups amongst ourselves, but I used them to guide the whole talk)

- 1. Why are you part of THIS church? How did it make you feel? What is it about the experience you loved? What is it about this church that makes it special? How did this experience affect you and who you've become? What was the lesson from that experience that you'll carry with you today? Of all the things, what makes THIS one the experience you share?
- 2. What does our church have to do to make it's mark?
- 3. Why does our congregation do what we do?
- 4. Why do we exist? Why has God planted us here, in this place, today?
- 5. Why US?

There were a number of people sharing stories of how they felt welcomed by not only Pastor, but by other members of the congregation that came up to talk to them when they were new to the church. Part of it was through making introductions to other members who either lived in the same community (Hull, Weymouth; not just Hingham) or came from near the same hometown to relocate here. Another part was the opportunity with Sunday School and other Cristian Education.

A number of comments reflected around the work we do with other organizations in our area (Wellspring, food pantry, Habitat for Humanity, etc.) and how that ability to give and serve others no matter in how small of a fashion is a large inspiration and overall "good" feeling for ourselves and those around us. Someone specifically mentioned that this is a way that we can not only talk about how we can help others but "walk the walk". Another mentioned how this is a way that we can live in our faith. It also seemed important to have MANY opportunities and agencies to support, so folks could pick and choose which ones spoke to them the most. This included the important work of the shepherds providing ministry to our own members.

Many of the big answers to WHY our church in particular were along the same lines as the comments above. They included the feeling of forgiveness and the Spirit beginning to end through the word of God, the theology/messages being shared and feeling a connection to them; that we were a welcoming & accepting congregation, we have the fellowship hall that is available not only for our use but for outside agencies/groups, a sense of community and connecting with each other, how this is a comforting and peaceful place, like a part of our family, outreach & service to others, familiarity in our worship style, and of course the MUSIC!

How this made us all feel was appreciated (this in part also included being recognized for the work we do and to recognize others who help us reach these goals), our active and creative worship (think themes, blessing of the animals), uplifted and moved, and overall, we looked forward to worship together.

Some suggestions for the future were to have more sharing opportunities (like these groups, other small groups), having opportunities to serve posted in the church-not just on the table to sign up, but also something that is ever present (and being updated) with what we do, like a list of "what this church does" INSIDE and outside of our walls. This included perhaps posting more to the local news areas and social media, having Social Mavens start an Instagram account for us (to reach younger ages). An idea also came up for someone from Social Mavens (who manages our website and social media) come to talk to us all during coffee hour about how we can ALL spread our good works on our own social media to help increase our overall presence.
