

A few changes in the Shepherding Committee...two new members! Sue Bose and Kate Bergman. Sue is now chairperson after many years of appreciated co-leadership by Barbara Buntrock and Linda Lundin. Sue and Kate join the Committee's existing members: Barbara, Linda, Carla Hill, Mardie Reimold, Dorothy Flett. Thanks and "you will be missed" to Ursula Hackemer who is stepping down from the committee this year. Although often referred to as the Shepherds Committee, in the church bylaws the committee is officially the Shepherding Committee which gives a clearer indication of its purpose. The Shepherding Committee "shall minister to the congregation members in times of need and shall reach out to those who are inactive to enable them to feel once again connected to and welcome in this congregation". The Committee has been doing just that. The Committee and a network of supporting "Shepherds" are sending cards, calling and in many cases visiting 14 present and past congregants whom we know are not able to attend services. Cards are also sent to church friends whom we have not seen in recent weeks reminding them that they are missed. And we have provided a weekly meal as long as it was needed to one of our church members. While the Committee has a history of providing a meal following funeral services held at the church, we unfortunately are unable to do so now. When possible, if requested, we hope to be able to set up the Fellowship Hall and provide coffee and desserts. Happy *almost* fall! Although with everything pumpkin spice starting to come out, one would think fall is already here!

We have a number of things planned for Sunday School! September 10th will be an unofficial start with a meet and greet, and coffee hour will be hosted by Christian Education as well. In the event of rain, we will have some craft activities available for folks to work on.
