Day of Mourning

Since 1970, an annual march and rally organized by the United American Indians of New England (UAINE) have taken place on the fourth Thursday in November, a day known as Thanksgiving holiday in the United States, but a day that many Indigenous people and supporters have come to know and commemorate as the National Day of Mourning. This tradition and commemoration serve as a solemn occasion to honor Native ancestors and Wampanoag stories, while fostering greater awareness and understanding among the American public about the destructive presence of pilgrims and settlers in and around Patuxet, currently also known as Plymouth.

You are invited to Plymouth to stand in solidarity with the Wampanoag people and the United American Indians of New England at this year's National Day of Mourning and gain deeper insights into their vital mission.

Wellspring: Social Ministry will be preparing Christmas boxes for holiday dinners. See food list below; boxes are due December 10. Giving Tree: Victoria Warneck will be coordinating the Giving Tree again this year. This program is conducted in association with Ascentria. Wish lists are expected soon with gifts due in early December. The Christian Education students will decorate gift bags for this program.

Cookie Walk has been postponed until winter or spring 2024.

Father Bill's Update: We are providing about 25-35 lunches each time. The next chance to participate is Friday, December 1. Sign-up sheets are on the front table. In January 2024, there will be a new bedding and towel drive.

Veterans Meals: Meals continue to be delivered monthly to the veterans' home in Hingham. Millie Hill coordinates this program. Carla and Ernie also bring a meal over monthly.

ELCA Good Gifts: We plan to promote \$25 nutrition for a child and \$10 school supplies in February 2024. We will also do the Souper Bowl of Caring in February around the Super Bowl.

In Stitches: The group has prepared some blankets to be donated to refugees that have relocated to Massachusetts. They will continue to make more fleece blankets as needed.

Since the onslaught of Covid, our congregation has become smaller and older. The time and effort that goes into these events is now beyond the scope of our abilities. Perhaps you could honor your loved ones in a different way going forward. For example, a tree planted on our land with a ceremony at the planting; a plaque attached to the outside of a pew where your family member sat on Sunday mornings. These would be tributes to the deceased for all to see for years to come.

As your President and on my watch, it grieves me to share this news. I have made this decision after consultation with the Shepherds and they are in full agreement. In my heart, I know you are a loving and understanding congregation. We will find other ways to honor our beloved ones who have added so much to the history of House of Prayer.
