Pentecost by Malcolm Guite

Today we feel the wind beneath our wings
Today the hidden fountain flows and plays
Today the church draws breath at last and sings
As every flame becomes a Tongue of praise.
This is the feast of fire, air, and water
Poured out and breathed and kindled into earth.
The earth herself awakens to her maker
And is translated out of death to birth.
The right words come today in their right order
And every word spells freedom and release
Today the gospel crosses every border
All tongues are loosened by the Prince of Peace
Today the lost are found in His translation.
Whose mother-tongue is Love, in every nation.

This month we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples and empowered them to go out into the world to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all people. The same Holy Spirit that propelled the disciples into the Gospel life empowers us today. It has not ceased, but continues to inspire and teach us the language of God: the Love that unbinds and awakens us to fullness of life. As expressed in Guite's poem, this Gospel cannot help but cross through the limits and borders that humanity sets on itself. The Gospel seeks everyone out no matter their status in life to bring them the fruits of the Resurrection, meaning the promise of God's eternal and unconditional love and acceptance in both our life and our death. What a blessing we continue to receive from God, where we get to be formed in the image of Christ, gifting the community with human beings truly alive in the spirit of love and mercy for others.

Knowing this reality among us, I encourage you to explore and allow yourself to be led to wherever love is needed. We are currently witnesses to great suffering in the world. As we pray to God to bring peace, He also asks of us: How are we cultivating the spirit of peace? While these horrible conflicts rage, we might not think that we could contribute anything important to the world, that we have no power to solve the big problems. But that is the devil's

IVY Academy at House of Prayer

Beginning in April, House of Prayer and IVY Academy entered into an agreement to rent a portion of the church space to IVY for use for preschool.

IVY Academy is a new pre-school, providing care for infant, toddler, and preschool children in the age range of 3 months to 5 years, mornings Monday to Friday. The Co-Directors are Robin Dellot and Kristin Frey, Certified pre-school teachers.

IVY will use some of our classrooms during the week; they will be available for our use on the weekends.

Our 3-Year Agreement Basics

- 1. Rental space in the church
 - a. former Founders' room (IVY exclusive use)
 - b. classroom next to kitchen and nursery (shared use)
 - c. women's restroom (shared use)
 - d. front yard(playground) (shared use)
 - e. pick up/drop off in front circular driveway
- 2. Shared costs snow removal, trash removal
- 3. Upgrades provided by Ivy landscaping, painting, storage units, HVAC Unit

More information and the full legal agreement with more detail is available from the office.

Ascentria: School supplies collection for Ascentria will be happening in August.

Habitat for Humanity: In September, Ed and Nancy Martin with Kim Boyd are planning to work on a Habitat project in Kauai, Hawaii. The dates are September 28 through October 6. The cost is about \$1,700 per person excluding airfare. For more details, contact Ed Martin. They have started the new build in Cohasset.
