"Spirituality is that attitude which puts life at the center, and defends and promotes life against all the mechanisms of death, desiccation, or stagnation." — Leonardo Boff

What do we mean when we talk about Spirituality? Even more so, what do we mean specifically by a Christian Spirituality? Spirituality is a word often drained and diluted of any content that might make it meaningful. So I prefer to think of spirituality as rooted within a context of shared experience. In the Christian sense, we are rooted in the collective experience of the church witnessing to the power and love of God in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Thus, our spirituality is formed and directed by Christ, it is Christ-shaped.

Where does that lead us, to know we are spiritually formed by God in Christ? First and foremost, we recognize God has made us for a life in the Spirit. We feel the need to connect with the world around us, we are drawn to wonder and transcendence, we are drawn to the "more" quality in existence. We recognize that every breath we take is a gift, and thus this corresponds to our naturally human spirituality. However, as Christians, spirituality takes on further and deeper dimensions. Spirituality is the activity by which we connect to God's desire to be with humanity and prepare us for His reign in our midst. And that happens when we look at the world through the Christ-point of view. When we inhabit a Christ-shaped life, fashioned by the activities of prayer, community and sacrament, we develop this rooted spirituality, broken free from a private feeling of wonderment, to a collective experience of God being with us and the world.

With this in mind, I appreciate the definition that the Brazilian liberation theologian, Leonard Boff gives of spirituality as an attitude or disposition that puts life at the center versus the powers of death, decay and stuckness. In a nutshell, that is what God gifts us in Christ. It is the essence of the biblical story we have inherited. It is God's yes to our lives, it is God unshackling us from the

Habitat for Humanity Trip to Kauai!


We have limited space left for you to work with Habitat for Humanity in Kauai Hawaii! The trip runs from September 29 to October 6th.

ELCA New England Synod General Assembly 2024

Heidi Olsen Morales and Kathleen Almand, together with Pastor Emmanuel, attended the Synod Assembly on June 6,7 in Worcester. There were about 400 people there from all over New England – we sat with the southeastern MA group including Pastor Mary Hansen Joyce and Pastor Beatrice. Bishop Hazelwood gave a high-level presentation on the status of the Synod with a focus on how congregations are creatively addressing their financial challenges with blended congregations, space sharing with other denominations, and the holy closure of 11 congregations in the Synod. The Synod's financial position is returning to health in the post-Covid environment.

The major focus of the Assembly was the Election of the New Bishop. There were over a dozen candidates. The final candidate was selected through several sequential electronic ballots with many opportunities for presentations, Q&A etc. The issues addressed by speeches from the candidates included: how to address anti-racism in a meaningful way, how to better support lay ministries, rethinking transformation, and how to support the growing number of Spanish missions. Our new Bishop-elect is Pastor Nathan Pipho.

There were several presentations from Synod related organizations and initiatives:

- Thrivent since program started,1 million action teams have been formed and donations to churches through Thrivent membership are encouraged
- Honduras still no Synod mission trips due to safety concerns but the scholarship program is strong and supports about 20 students.
- Palestine there is an ELCA initiative to support to Lutheran churches there, Bishop Hazelwood to visit
- Calumet seems very vibrant and seen as a place for growth of young church leaders, Knute expressed his thanks for the gift of the piano from HOP, which was featured in their newsletter

Here are some ideas we took away for HOP:

- AAMPARO (refugee support how can we interact with churches actively supporting a refugee family – Pastor Mary on the Cape also interested
- Should we rekindle our interest in becoming a Welcoming)
- How can we better connect to/collaborate with other congregations
- How can we/our congregation support the diversification needed in the Lutheran church body

Heidi and I highly recommend the experience of being a HOP Synod delegate.

Good Gifts: The Social Ministry Committee is planning to promote backpacks filled with food from the ELCA Good Gifts catalog in August. The fee for the backpack is \$10.00. There will be envelopes for donations to be put in the offering plate. This will make it clear the intention of the donation.

Father Bill's: We continue to support Father Bill's through our monthly bag lunches. We are providing about 35 lunches each time thanks to the generosity of the congregation for donations. The most recent lunch was June 3. It was discussed that the smaller lunch bags will be replaced by larger lunch bags to accommodate larger lunch items. Father Bill's has an ongoing list of items including gift certificates needed for their visitors.

Father Bill's has also reported that they are overflowing with guests. If you want to contribute ingredients including gloves to prepare the sandwiches that would be greatly appreciated.

Father Bill's is building a new facility in Brockton with 30 new rooms for residents. The committee is looking at how we can be a sponsor for a room for approximately \$800.

Breakfast items are still being collected for Father Bills. Easy prep includes items such as cereal, oatmeal, granola bars, etc. This request is ongoing.

Habitat for Humanity: In September, Ed and Nancy Martin with Kim Boyd are planning to work on a Habitat project in Kauai, Hawaii. The dates are September 28 through October 6. The cost is about \$1,700 per person excluding airfare. For more details, contact Ed Martin.
