#### "How much greater is the God we have than the one we think we have."

- Fr. Gregory Boyle, Tattoos on the Heart: The Power of Boundless Compassion

As we embark on the waiting journey of Advent, we should remind ourselves of the story that the God we wait for inserted Himself into. There is a double movement in Advent, celebrating first how God comes close to us in Jesus, and secondly the advent of the fullness of God's incoming Kingdom that will make all things new. In this story, we witness a God, as Fr. Gregory Boyle affirms, is greater than the one we limit ourselves to have based on purely doctrinal, dogmatic and traditional terms. Nobody expected God to come down to us in the level that He did. Nobody expected God, from His impenetrable eternity, to take up vulnerability and share with us our pains, and sorrows and joys. Motivated from the fountain of His own being of Love, God undertakes a way that breaks every mold we try to put God in. And we should expect God to continue to break those limits we impose on Him.

How far can God's grace reach us? As far as He did in taking the very being of our humanity. How far can God's Love go? As the theologian Stanley Hauerwas remarked: "All the way down". Advent is a time of waiting, yes, it is a time of expectation, yes, but we must give space for that "something greater" than what we expect. God will surprise us in the ways that He will come to us and bless us with His presence. That "something greater" also might change our definition of greatness, for God's ways are not ours. In the Christmas story, God makes vulnerability, the poor, the marginalized, the place where He reveals Himself fully instead of power, riches, and callousness. I'm reminded by the 43<sup>rd</sup> sonnet of Elizabeth Barret Browning, when she answers the question "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways". God loves us to the depth, breadth and height of our own being, He loves us to the level of our every day's most quiet need. He is a surprising God, as love is always surprising and all-encompassing. So in our Advent waiting, let us give space for the "greater" God can be, let us make space for God to

## **Friends of the Homeless**

Once again, we are pleased that we can offer the Friends use of our Fellowship Hall for the month of December, so they can further their mission to help make Christmas a bit brighter for the homeless in our community. Program coordinator Polly Walker writes:

"On behalf of Executive Director Herb Newell and the Friends of the Homeless Holiday Giving team, I want to thank you for allowing us to use your Fellowship Hall again this year for our Christmas/Holiday Giving Program.

Having the Hall space available for volunteers to sort, wrap, organize, and store gifts last year meant we could deliver hundreds of gift bundles -- and holiday joy! -- to **more than 300 families and 700 children on the South Shore.** This year, as the number of families living temporarily in local hotels has steadily increased, **we expect those numbers to be even higher** --- and our need for the large space to be even more critical."

They will be using the Hall from **December 4 through December 23**. As in the past, we will relocate coffee hour to the Narthex.

### Social Ministry Cathy Martin, Chair

**Ascentria Ruth House**: Pastor is coordinating with the Ruth House to come to do a Temple Talk visit in December. We will give them any additional prayer shawls we have ready at that time.

Kathleen added that we provided funds for an Ascentria family but they still cannot find a place. As soon as they move in, they will send us a video clip.

**Father Bill's Update**: Ann continues to organize monthly bag lunches; the next date is December 14. We discussed doing another sandwich assembly activity on March 9, 2025. This time with peanut butter and jelly since we already have that. We just need to get the bread. The In Stitches group made six blankets to be donated to Father Bill's as well as a collection of handmade scarves and hats.

In January, we will collect new sheets and blankets for the new facility in Brockton. The committee is also planning to sponsor a room at the new facility with an approximate cost of \$650, a one-time cost. The congregation will be invited to help with the sponsorship. The committee will cover any balance remaining. The cost is to cover new items needed to start a new apartment including pots and pans, dishes, sheets, and other items. A list will be provided.

**Wellspring**: Per our tradition, we will put together Dinner boxes for the Christmas holidays for Wellspring. On December 8 we will have an intergenerational event after church service with members wrapping the boxes and assembling them for pick up by Wellspring on December 9th. Since the Friends of the Homeless folks are using the Hall, packing will take place in the Narthex.

**Ascentria**: Victoria Warneck (thank you!) is coordinating the Giving Tree for the holiday season. We continue to collect gifts in the office until December 8.

**Friends of the Homeless**: The group is willing to work around the preschool hours which would be after 2:00 in the afternoon and on weekends. The details will be shared with Ivy for their approval. This would be happening in December. Pastor is going to check with Friends of the Homeless to see how the congregation can support this December activity.

**God's Work, Our Hands**: The plan is to do another cookie walk on May 4, 2025 (after Lent and Easter). Any proceeds would benefit the Weymouth Food Pantry.

**Veterans' Home**: Members are still providing meals to the Home twice a month. Thanks to everyone who participates in this program. For more information about meal prep, please see Millie Hill.

## **Christmas Dinner Boxes**

The Social Ministry Committee is organizing the collection of dinner boxes for Wellspring's food pantry. Please wrap your copy paper box festively like you would wrap a gift (wrap the lid separate from the box.)

#### Items for the Boxes

- 1-3 lb. ham or 3-1 lb. hams (must not require refrigeration)\*
- 1-16 oz. can pineapple or 2 small cans
- 2 cans of vegetables
- 1 box or bag of granulated sugar
- 1 box hot cocoa (bulk or single pack)
- nuts and/or hard candy

1 package cookies (home-made or store bought)

#### Boxes are due December 9th

\*Hams can often be found at Rite Aid, Walgreens, CVS, BJ's or the canned meat aisle of your supermarket.

In addition to the items listed above, please fill the box with other non-perishable items such as pasta, sauce, tuna or canned chicken, soups, peanut butter, canned fruit, etc. Toothpaste, soap and other toiletries are also much needed items (including travel/sample size.)
